ATTACHMENT A: VERMONT PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD 1999- 2005

As Chairman of Vermont's utility regulatory commission, I was responsible for the terms, conditions of service, and environmental aspects of more than \$ 1.1 billion in annual utility expenses. For representative work-product, see "Attachment C: Selected Decisions."

The core of this work was a complex litigation docket, involving well over a hundred contestedcases each year. I managed an annual budget of over \$2.6 million and oversaw a staff of 26 Hearing Officers, lawyers, economists, engineers, environmental specialists and support staff. I was also responsible for more than a dozen contracts, including professional service contracts, accounting and auditing contracts for several million dollars of utility 'universal service' funds, and up to \$17.5 million per year for acquisition and delivery of energy efficiency resources.

My primary duties as Chairman of the Public Service Board were:

1) to conduct trial-like hearings, pursuant to the Vermont Rules of Civil Procedure and of Evidence (lightly modified by the Board's procedural rules),

2) to act as an appellate judge, reviewing the trial-like decisions of the Hearing Officers through consideration of the record, briefs filed by parties, and oral argument, and

3) to manage the 26 FTE personnel and ca. 100 litigants in the PSB 'court system' so that a hundred or more cases per year were resolved efficiently, predictably, and fairly.

My secondary duties included:

1) exercise of the Board's rulemaking authority,

2) responses to legislative inquiries and requests for testimony,

3) oversight of the Board's administrative needs, including the Clerk's office, exempt and classified personnel, budgeting and fiscal control and,

4) representing Vermont's interests before regional bodies and Federal agencies.

Significant achievements in Vermont's utility world while I was Chairman included:

1. Lowering the burden of electricity costs for Vermont residents and businesses: Vermont had 2d-highest electric rates in the seven north-eastern states in 1999 and improved to having the lowest such rates by mid-2005. The burden of Commercial & Industrial electric costs went down from 1.9% of Gross State Product to less than 1.6%. Residential electric bills dropped from 3.9% of disposable personal income to 3.3%.

2. Keeping pollution extraordinarily low:

Carbon, sulfur, mercury and particulate emissions from electricity generation for Vermont are at lowest levels (absolute and per-capita) of all U.S. states.

3. Launching and sustaining a state-wide energy-efficiency program recognized for excellence: The Kennedy School awarded \$100,000 to Efficiency Vermont in 2003 as one of the five best governmental programs in the United States. Savings are over \$6 million per year, and rising.

4. Requiring an independent engineering assessment of Vermont Yankee Nuclear Power Station, leading to unprecedented Nuclear Regulatory Commission evidentiary hearing and investigation of power-uprate. News media called it a "near-miracle" that all parties praised the Board decision.

5. Rejecting offers to buy the Vermont Yankee Nuclear Power Station until the price rose from \$8 million to \$180 million, with a stable power purchase contract priced well below market. The effect is to save Vermonters 4% per year on their electricity bills for twenty years.

6. Ending the prospects of imminent bankruptcy, which had stressed Vermont's electric utilities from 1998 to 2001.

9. Deciding cases swiftly, but with the best appellate record in fifty years.Reduced open dockets from 175 in 1999 to 79 in 2005 despite increased filings.Of eighteen cases appealed, the Vermont Supreme Court remanded or reversed only one.

10. Reducing telecommunication charges to Vermonters by 20% – saving Vermonters almost \$200 million (\$30 million in 2001 and \$40 million for each of the next four years).

11 Increasing the proportion of Vermonters with the option to buy high-speed telecom and cablebroadband services from virtually zero in 1999 to more than 75% of Vermonters by 2004. This was despite Adelphia Cable's nationwide bankruptcy and Verizon's national DSL deployment freeze.

12. Winning major matters before Federal agencies. These included:

* Better tests of market-power control for wholesale electric markets.

* Governance rules for New England's Regional Transmission Organization.

* Obtaining federal funds of \$ 23.1 million per year for Vermont telecom services.

* Stopping the merger of the New England electricity system into the New York Transmission Organization.

13. Bringing Public Service Board expense-budget in *under* target for 6 years in a row (averaging 4 - 5% below an annual budget of \$2.3 to \$2.6 million).

ATTACHMENT B: RISER MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS

From 1995 to 1999 I was a management partner in Riser Management Systems, L.P., a telecommunications engineering and consulting firm specializing in meeting the needs of the owners and tenants of Class A commercial office buildings.

In those years, my partners and I built our Vermont-based company from four staff to 31 employees, while achieving an eight-fold increase in overall revenues and a twenty-fold increase in recurring revenues.

My management responsibilities included company-wide strategic planning, legal review of all contracts and corporate documents, and approval of all business issues and plans.

My work also involved revenue and cost projections, evaluations of employees' consulting performance, balancing work-force capabilities with job commitments, and coordinating hiring and expansion decisions with my partners.

I also had direct management responsibility for Riser's Consulting Division. This involved coordination, scheduling and quality control for the consulting work of fifteen engineers, lawyers and financial analysts.

Most importantly, it meant making sure that the critical business needs of more than 100 clients were clearly understood and then satisfied with speed, efficiency and accuracy.

There is no room for delay when 600 telecom lines are needed "now" to secure an anchor tenant for a half-vacant office building.

When a new 450 unit residential tower expects tenants in two months and will have its walls open for only a three-week period during its construction schedule, responsiveness and reliability are vital.

One of my management duties was making sure that Riser consistently met such challenges.
