ABOUT CLIC

The Community Legal Information Center (CLIC) opened in July 2015, shortly after Vermont's State Library's law program closed in Montpelier. Financed by an annual grant from the Vermont Department of Libraries and operated by Vermont Law and Graduate School (VLGS) librarians and staff, CLIC is Vermont's free legal reference service for the general public.

CLIC...

Provides legal reference, information, and referral services. CLIC also teaches patrons how to use legal databases and search reference materials, and promotes access to research guides.

CLIC collaborates with Vermont agencies, the Vermont Judiciary, the Vermont Legislature, the Vermont Bar Association, legal service providers, and other entities while advancing Vermont Law and Graduate School's mission, "Law for the Community and the World."

Please note that as a private institution, VLGS policies are not the same as a public institution.

Law librarians are unable to provide legal advice.

Librarians are available to suggest legal resources and provide guidance on how to use resources.

If you need a lawyer, librarians will provide information on potential sources of legal help.
