2. The two **U.S. Small Business Administration fact sheets** (*Reasons for Starting a Business* and *Frequently Asked Questions*, July 2024), provided via Teams.
 - a. You will not be tested on these statistics. Just get a sense of the landscape. We will be discussing business ownership and our relationships with our clients more broadly.
3. BUSINESS STRUCTURES, **Ch. 1 §§ A-C (pp. 1 – 14)**.
 - a. First class pacing is hard to predict. We may only discuss *Dodge v. Ford Motor Co.* and *A.P. Smith* on Thursday, but please do read these materials, just in case.
 - b. *Dodge v. Ford* assumes you understand what a “[dividend](#)” is. We will discuss dividends at great length throughout the course, but for now, just understand that when a company has money available that isn’t otherwise committed, it can choose to distribute some of it back to its owners (here, shareholders). [Investopedia’s dictionary](#) is a great resource for looking up unfamiliar financial terms.
 - c. That case also assumes, apparently, that you know what “semi-eleemosynary” means. I had no idea, and don’t think it will come up again. “[Eleemosynary](#)” means “relating to charity.”
