THE **DEGREE**

The LLM in Environmental Law offers students the opportunity to choose courses from the largest environmental law curriculum in the country. Students can take a variety of courses or choose to specialize in cutting-edge areas such as climate change or environmental, social, and governance (ESG). Those looking for hands-on experience may participate in one of six on-campus environmental clinics or pursue an off-campus externship. Students also have the option of writing a thesis on the topic of their choice, under the supervision of a faculty member.

The degree prepares students for a career practicing environmental law with a private firm, a state or federal environmental agency, or as a public interest environmental litigator. Graduates are employed in a variety of roles, including:

- Public Interest Lawyer, Friends of Nature
- Director of Inspection and Risk Management, Dominican Republic Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources
- Managing Director for Regulatory Affairs and ESG, Kinterra Capital
- Environmental Justice and Community Engagement Manager, Washington State Department of Transportation

The degree can be completed residentially or online. Hybrid options are also available.
