THE DEGREE

The MARJ program is for students who want to address deficiencies in our justice system while gaining an in-depth understanding of restorative justice domestically, internationally, and cross culturally. Designed by the faculty of the **Center for Justice Reform**, the unique curriculum combines traditional law school courses with restorative justice courses created specifically for the MARJ degree. Graduates will use their skills as leaders to advocate in the field of restorative justice (RJ) at a regional and national level.

A master's degree from VLGS opens doors to externships and jobs at organizations, including:

- Vermont Community Justice Centers
- Vermont Attorney General's Office
- New England Innocence Project
- European Forum for Restorative Justice

The degree can be completed residentially or online. Students can also combine interests and complete a joint degree and receive a JD and a MARJ. Hybrid options are also available for this program.
